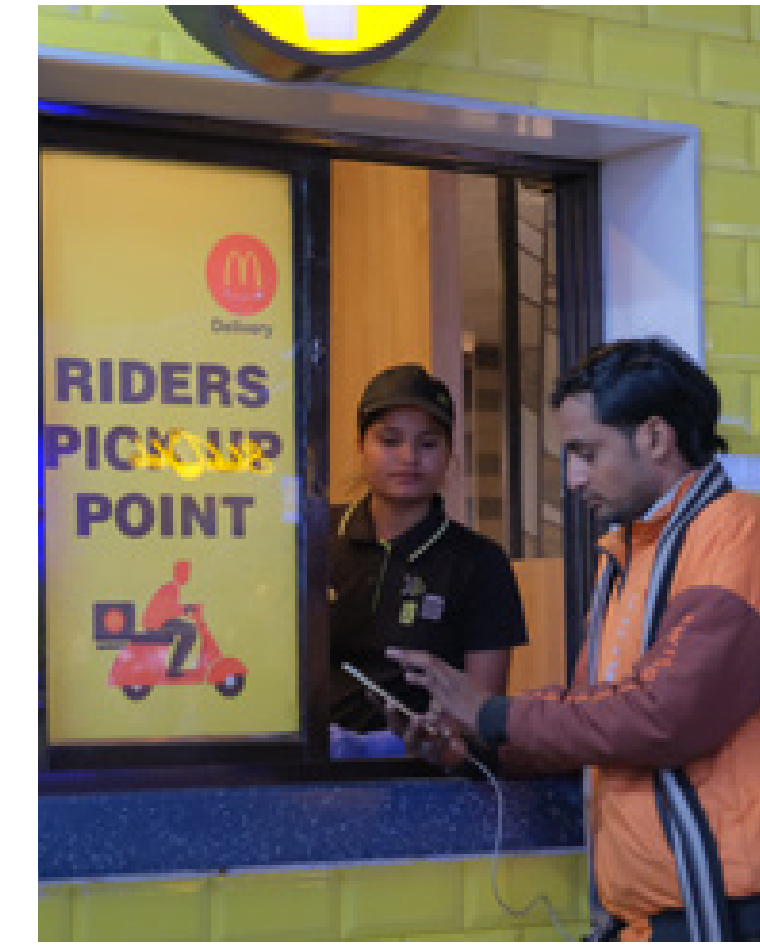

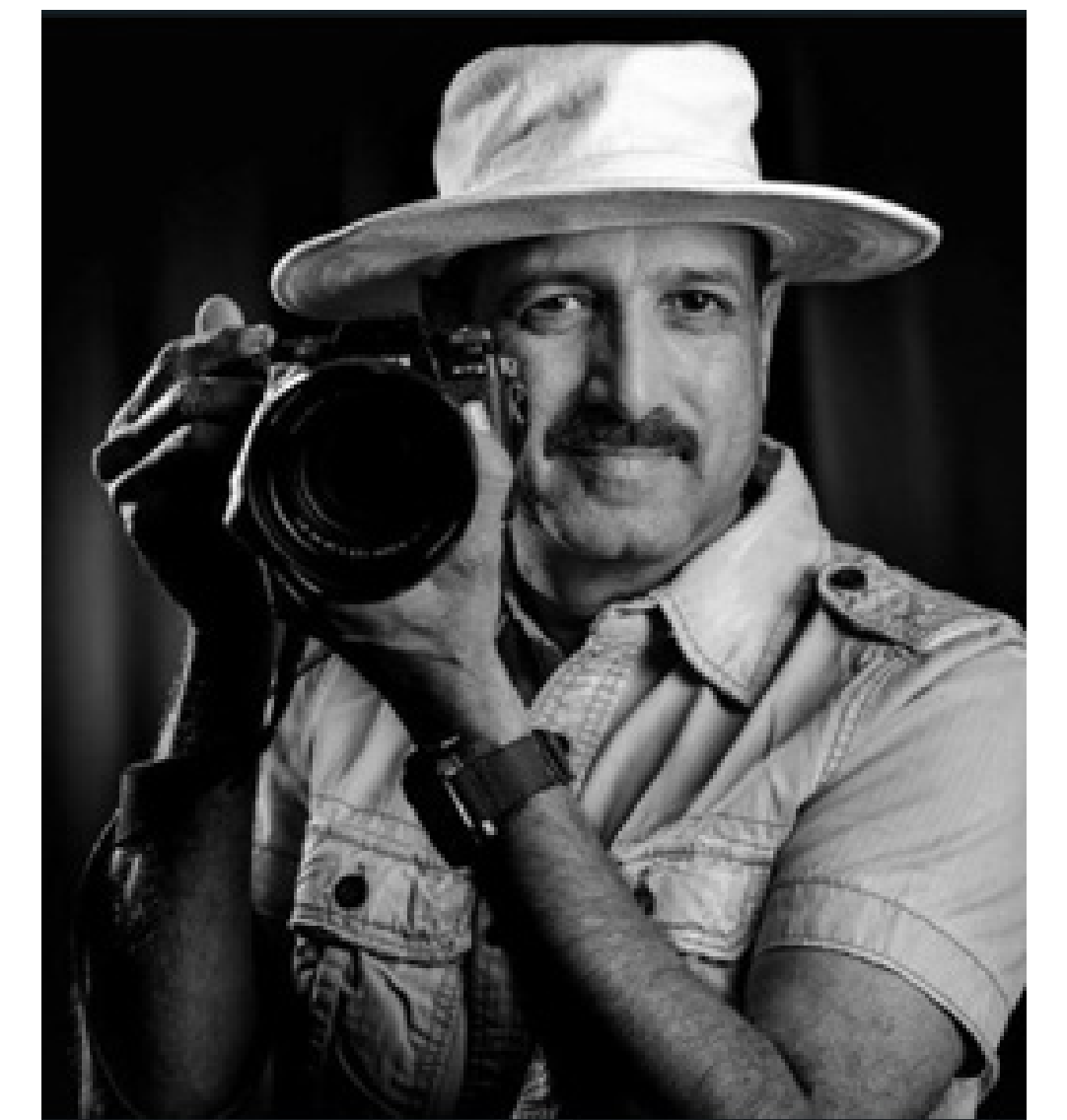

enriching the seminar's discourse.

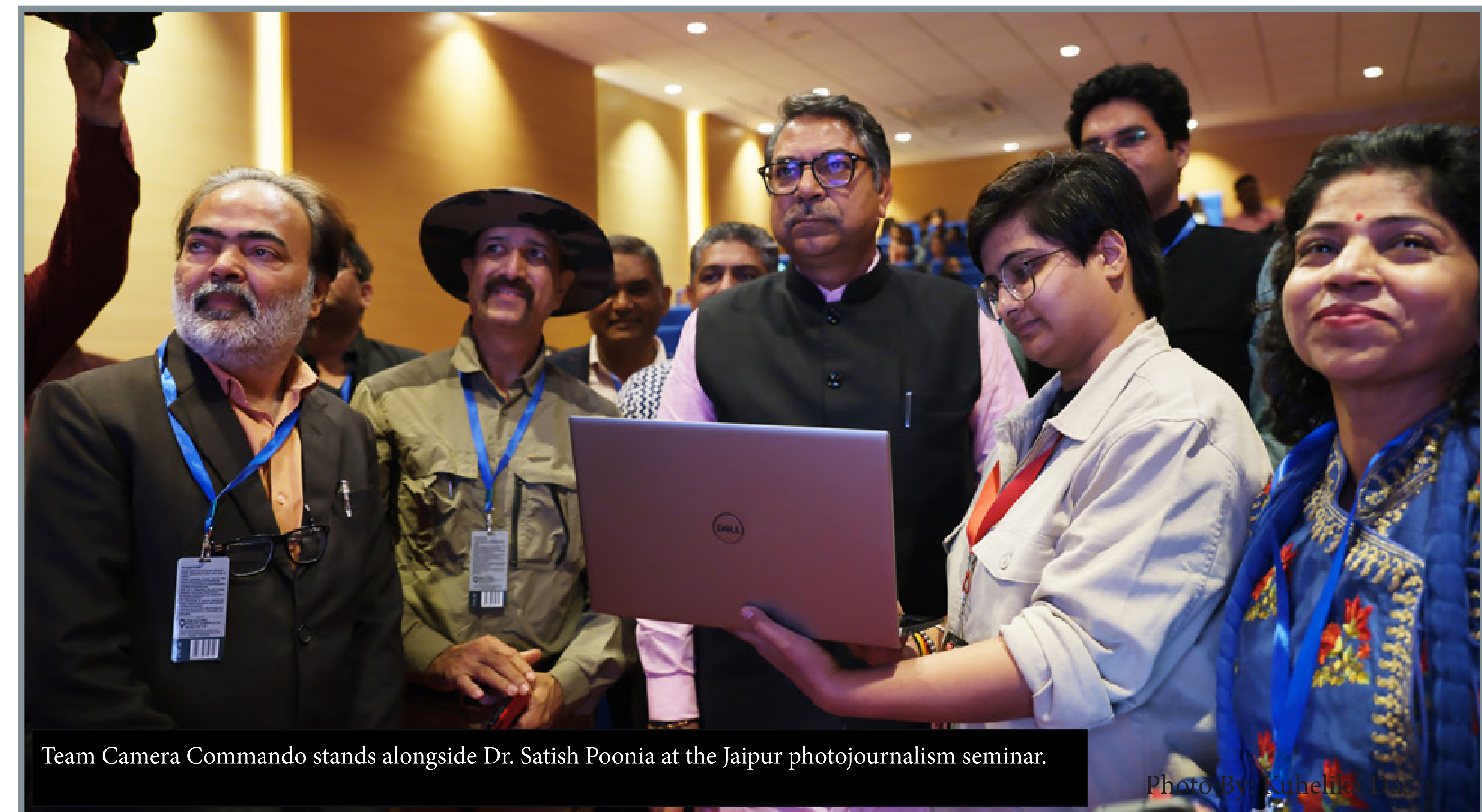

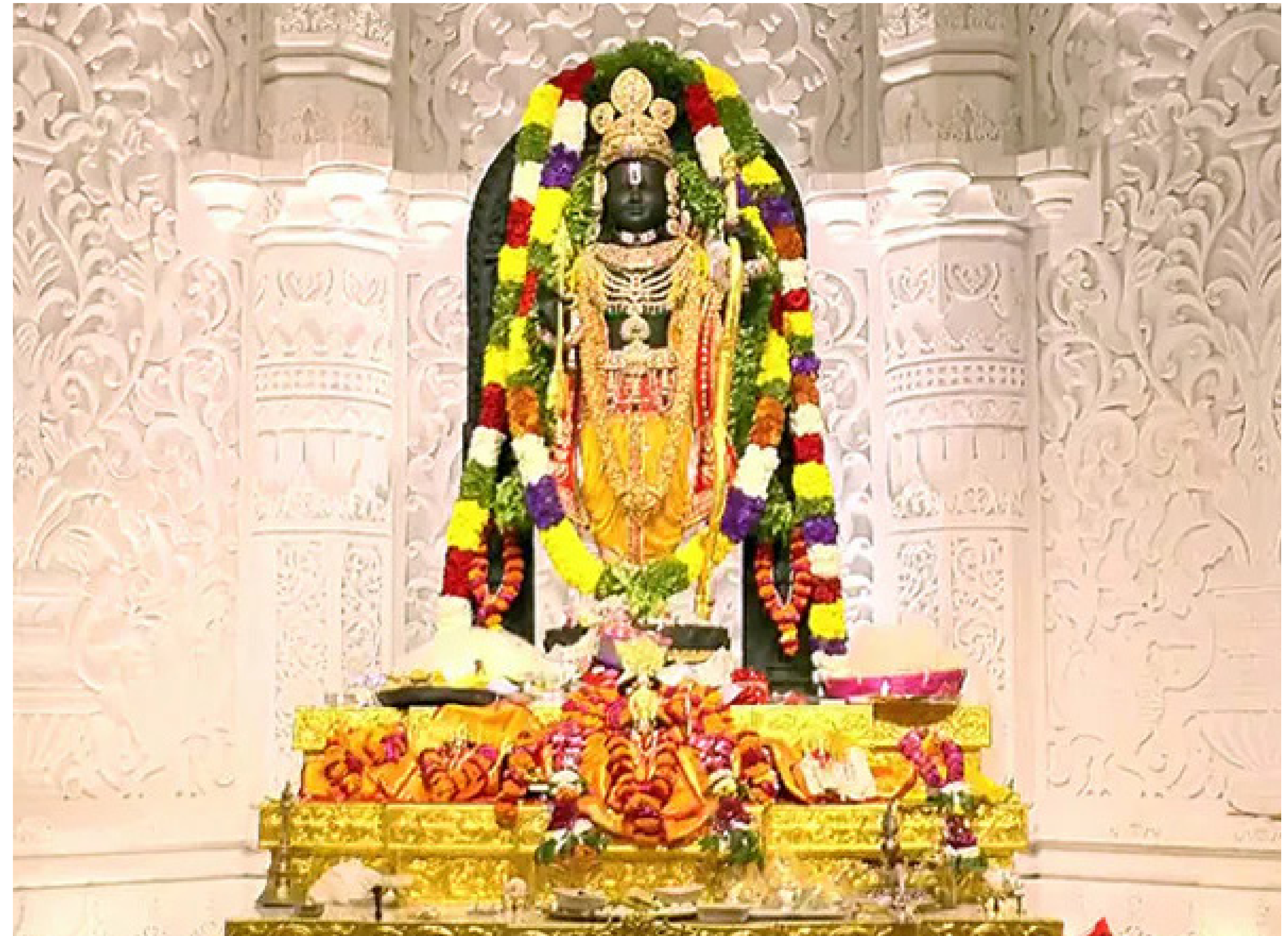
